This one day workshop introduces participants to the core concepts of Equine Facilitated Experiential Learning and the Eponaquest Method. In this workshop we will work with horses to experience:



- Using emotion as information
- Tapping into intuition/ wise mind, listening to subtle messages from within
- A more finely attuned awareness of emotional cues (yours and others), energetic awareness and intuitive insights
- Hands on ground-based exercises with horses as guides
- Body Scan: listening to the body as sensing device

When we can listen deeply from within, we have more emotional agility, increased energetic awareness, and intuitive insights. **Working alongside the natural wisdom, grace, and power of the horse we can learn to do just this.** Constantly paying attention to subtle messages from within themselves and their environment, horses are the perfect teachers.
